DIRECT TAX PROPOSALS

DIRECT TAX PROPOSALS

- Surcharge of certain AOPs to be capped at 15%.
- A new section 194R has been introduced, wherein, TDS @ 10% has been proposed to be levied on any benefit or perquisite whether convertible into money or not arising from business or profession on amount exceeding Rs.20,000.
- Section 115BAB of the Act relating to tax @ 15% on income of certain domestic companies is extended to 31/03/2024.
- Surcharge on Long Term Capital Gain on any assets to be levied at 15%, which is presently on shares only.
- Penalty u/s 272A on failure to comply with the statutory requirements is increased from Rs. 100 to Rs. 500 per day.
- Section 14A disallowance shall be made even if exempt income has not accrued or arisen or has not been received during the previous year.




